GRAND OLE OPERA k.d. lang headlined James Wright's Vancouver Opera Overture Gala in May, one of the most buzzed-about parties of the arts season. Guests enjoyed a spectacular Four Seasons catered dinner served on the Queen Elizabeth Theatre stage. Proceeds contributed to the opera's full recovery from an accumulated deficit.

BEST PERIOD PARTY Thrifty Foods' Megan Du Preez was period perfect in February for the Downton Abbey do in Victoria celebrating the \$52-million renovation of the Oak Bay Beach Hotel.

BEST DANCE PARTY A night at the Roxy! Vancouver house band Dr. Strangelove - from left, Rich Sera, Peter Barone, Kelly Brock, Kevin Coles, Sarah Johns and Andre Kunkel - marked their 20th anniversary at the venerable Granville Street cabaret in January.

FLOWER POWER Paladin Security chief Ashley Cooper escorted his wife, committee member Julie, to the Daffodil Ball in April. The former Miss Vancouver convinced finance minister Mike de Jong to gift \$1 million, almost doubling the Canadian Cancer Society's haul to \$2.1 million.

BIG CATCH Delta Land development president Bruce Langereis landed singer Jann Arden to perform at West Coast Fishing Club's kickoff party at Hotel Georgia in August. The fishing derby off Haida Gwaii netted \$1.17 million for the Canucks Autism Network.

FEAST OF FORTUNE The God of Fortune - Royal Pacific Realty's Richard Cheung - bestowed health, happiness and prosperity to Tapestry Foundation gala-goers in February. A recordbreaking \$522,000 was raised from the multi-course diner for Mount Saint Joseph's Rapid Access Breast Clinic.

LARGER THAN LIFE In June, Lorne Segal, right, chaired the \$2.1-million Coast Mental Health Gala fundraiser in honour of his parents, Joe and Rosalie Segal. The spectacular tribute in three musical acts drew 1,500 business titans, power players and community builders - the largest gathering of the year - to the Convention Centre.

BEST HOUSE PARTY Spurred on by the goal of raising \$1 million for local charities, acclaimed author Jackie Collins stepped up and auctioned off a character in her next book at Jacqui Cohen's sellout \$1,500-a-ticket Face the World Gala house party in June.

PARTY OF THE YEAR

Casey Wright, 13, who received treatment for a brain tumour at B.C. Children's Hospital, was ringmaster at the circus-themed Crystal Ball in November, the biggest party of the year.
